Goal:

Students develop an understanding of leadership characteristics/traits.

After discussing leadership, students will list five leadership characteristics with 100% accuracy.

Prior Knowledge:

Anticipatory Set	
Teacher Actions	Student Actions
<p>Ask students to name a leader they know and ask them to list what they noticed about each person.</p> <p>When student finish the task, the teacher leads a whole group discussion on what was noticed about the leaders the students identified.</p> <p>Introduce vocabulary used in the lesson. Leadership, Characteristics/Traits, Strengths, Weaknesses, Virtues, Actions, Citizen</p> <p>Definitions are listed under the lesson plan.</p>	<p>Working in pairs, students identify a leader they know and discuss and record what they notice about the person.</p>
Establishing the Purpose of the Lesson	
Teacher Actions	
<p>Explain to the students that today's lesson is about leadership.</p> <p>Explain the students will explore a variety of leadership characteristics/traits, skills, and behaviors of effective leaders.</p> <p>Explain students will then reflect on how they might develop their own leadership skills.</p>	
Guided Practice	
Teacher Actions	Student Actions
<p>Ensure students have computers and internet access.</p> <p>Divide students into two groups to watch a video of one story:</p> <p>Group 1: The Albatross: a story about LEADERSHIP Dramatic Read-Aloud Timmy reads books 7:41</p> <p>Group 2: READ-ALOUD - The 7 Highly Effective Animals I Timmy Reads Books</p> <p>Next, provide each student with the appropriate worksheet:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Group 1: The Albatross Video Worksheet Group 2: The 7 Effective Animals Video Worksheet <p>As students discuss each story, complete the worksheet and create the chart paper record, the teacher circulates among student groups observing conversations and offering support to ensure students are engaged and on target.</p>	<p>First, students will watch a video of the assigned story.</p> <p>Second, in their group, students will discuss their assigned story and complete their worksheet.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Albatross Video Worksheet The 7 Effective Animals Video Worksheet <p>Third, each group uses chart paper to record major points of the assigned article and presents to the other group.</p>

Independent Practice & Assessment

Teacher Actions

Students watch the video of the story not assigned in Guided Practice:

Teacher observes, allowing students to complete the assessment independently.

Student Actions

Assessment:

- After watching the second book, students list five leadership characteristics.

Closing Activity

Teacher Actions

Teacher opens a discussion regarding what students learned about leadership and about being a knowledgeable citizen during the lesson. Next, ask students to discuss how they might apply the information learned.

(Explain the leadership characteristics are examples of virtues and actions related to being a responsible and knowledgeable citizen.)

Student Actions

Students discuss what they learned about leadership and being a knowledgeable citizen and how it can be applied to their lives.

1. Leadership	Leadership is when you show others the right way to do things by being kind, helpful, and making good choices. It's like being a good example for your friends and helping everyone work together as a team.
2. Characteristics / Traits	Characteristics or traits are special qualities or features that make each of us unique. It's like the things that describe how you act, feel, or look that make you who you are.
3. Strength	Strength is something you're good at or something that makes you feel brave and confident. It's like when you practice riding a bike and get better at it, or when you stand up for what you believe in.
4. Weakness	Weakness is something that's a little hard for you, like maybe you find it tough to do something or feel shy about it. It's okay because everyone has things they're still learning or working on.
5. Virtues	Virtues are good habits or qualities that help us be kind, honest, and brave. They're like superpowers that make us do the right thing and make others happy.
6. Actions	Actions are things you do, like jumping, laughing, helping a friend, or even saying 'hello!' They're like the moves you make in a game or the things you do every day.
7. Citizen	A citizen is like a member of a big club called a country. It's someone who lives in a place, follows its rules, and helps make it a nice place for everyone to live.
